INTRODUCTION

Maharana Pratap Govt. Degree College, Amb came into being on 18th June 1997 when the Govt. of Himachal Pradesh took over the erstwhile National College, Amb, was established in 1970. This College is situated in the center of Amb town, 32 Kilometers away from Una, the District headquarters, on the National Highway 503(extension) leading to the famous shrine of Goddess Maa Chintpurniji. This college is imparting education in Science, Arts, and Commerce at the undergraduate level and courses in English and Commerce at the postgraduate level to the students, mostly from the rural & remote areas with an emphasis on moral values and personality development to make them ideal citizens and good human beings.

To fulfill the persistent demand of the people of the area adjoining Amb, Self-Financing courses BBA, BCA & PGDCA were introduced in the College from the academic session 2010-2011 with the permission and approval of H.P. Govt. and Himachal Pradesh University, respectively. These courses equip the students with technical skills and proficiency and open for them avenues of job opportunities in the public and private sectors.

The College has sufficient infrastructure in the form of a spacious campus, a well-equipped Central Library & a Departmental Library, Two IT Labs, One Language Lab, One Computer Hardware Lab, Smart classrooms, a multi-purpose hall, a separate girl's common room, a gymnasium, and lecture -theatres.

OBJECTIVE

The main objective of introducing these courses is to provide quality education in computer applications and business management to the aspirants of the remote & rural areas of the district so that they can earn their livelihood anywhere in the country by competing with those who are pursuing such professional courses from other institutes.

DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT & COMPUTER APPLICATION

DETAIL OF COURSES UNDER THE DEPARTMENT

1. BACHELOR OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (BCA), BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (BBA) and POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (PGDCA)

The duration of BBA & BCA courses is three years, spread over six semesters and for PGDCA duration of the course is one year, spread over two semesters. There shall be an examination at the end of each semester. The total number of seats in each course is 80, distributed asunder:

Note: EWS, Single Girl Child or any other supernumerary reservation as per AICTE norms will also be considered for admission.

MODE OF ADMISSION:**A) SUBSIDIZED SEATS**

The admission to these courses will be made based on the merit of their qualifying examination. As per H.P. University rules 75% of seats will be filled out by the candidates who have passed their 10+2 (for BBA & BCA) and Graduation (for PGDCA) examination from a school/college situated in Himachal Pradesh, irrespective of the Board/University. The remaining 25% of seats will be filled on an all-India basis. Other reservation rules of H.P. University shall be applicable.

B) NON-SUBSIDIZED SEATS

This applies only to NRIs and Management Quota categories. In the case of NRI students, admission will be based on merit in the last examination passed by the candidate.

PROOF OF STATUS IN THE CASE OF NRIs:

For this purpose, any of the following documents shall be considered as proper proof:

- (a) Copy of Non-Resident card /Employment Card issued by the employer.
- (b) Photocopy of the Immigration card / Employment VISA entry on the passport, along with details of the passport.
- (c) Certificate issued by the Indian Embassy/ High Commission in the country where the NRI is residing.
- (d) Photocopy of the latest assessment order of Income Tax Authorities either in India or the country of employment, filled in the status of NRIs.

In case of non-availability of NRIs/Management Quota, the seats under non-subsidized category will be filled as per the order of merit in the application. No reservation of any kind will be given under this category.

TO RESOLVE A TIE: -

- (a) In case of a tie, the candidate having higher aggregate marks in the qualifying examination shall be admitted first.
- (b) If the tie is still not resolved, the candidate older in age will be admitted first.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS:**A) FOR BBA & BCA**

1. Candidates who have passed the 10+2 examination from H.P. Board/CBSE/ICSE or any other examination considered equivalent to 10+2 by Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla , for BBA 45% Marks(40% marks for SC/ST) and for BCA with 50% Marks (45% marks for SC/ST category) shall be eligible.

Candidates who have appeared in the qualifying examination are also eligible to apply provisionally in this course, but they will be entitled to admission only if they have secured the minimum prescribed percentage of marks in their qualifying examination and submit all relevant documents, including final mark- sheet of qualifying examination at the time of counseling.

2. AGE LIMIT

The maximum age limit for admission to BBA & BCA 1st July is 23 years for the General category, 26 years for the SC/ST category, and 25 years for girl candidates, as on 1st July of the year concerned, i.e., on 01.07.2026. The Vice Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to a maximum of six months.

B) FOR PGDCA

1. Candidates who have passed the undergraduate examination from H.P. University or any other University recognized by UGC with 50% Marks (45% marks for SC/ST category) shall be eligible.

2. AGE LIMIT

The maximum age limit for the PGDCA course is 26 years (28 years for girls) as on 01.07.2026. However, in the case of candidates belonging to scheduled castes/scheduled tribes, there will be a relaxation of three years. The Vice Chancellor shall have the power to permit age relaxation for reasons to be recorded in writing up to a maximum of six months.

Candidates who have appeared in the qualifying examination are also eligible to apply for this course, but they will be entitled to admission only if they have secured the minimum prescribed percentage of marks in their qualifying examination and submit all relevant documents, including the final mark- sheet of qualifying examination at the time of counseling.

The H.P. University 120 points roster will be followed for admission to BCA, BBA & PGDCA, and reservation for the session 2026-27 shall be followed from 61 to 120points and thereafter 1 to 20of the 120 Points Roaster.

CONDITIONS FOR MIGRATION CASES

1. The Original Migration certificate of a Board/University from which the candidate migrates to this college will be submitted.
2. Migration from another college affiliated to HPU and vice versa is governed by HP University rules.
3. The migrating student must bring with him/her:
 - i) Lecture attendance statement
 - ii) Statement of marks obtained in the Minor Tests
 - iii) Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.
4. After the migration has been sanctioned and notified by the University, the student must join the new college within the given period i.e., by the date given by the University.
5. On joining the new college, the student will have to pay all the funds for a full year, whereas the tuition fee will be payable from the month of his joining.
6. No migration certificate can be issued unless the student is registered with another University.
7. A candidate migrating from this college will have to obtain clearance from the college office, the Library, NCC, NSS, sports, and other concerned departments.

WITHDRAWAL OF ADMISSION BY THE CANDIDATE & REFUND OF FEE:

If a student chooses to withdraw from the program of study in which he /she is enrolled. The institution concerned shall follow the following five-tier system for the refund of fees remitted to students as per letter no 1-533/2016-HPU(Acad.) dated 13-12-2023 of Himachal Pradesh University and D.O.NO.F.2-71/2022(CPP-II) dated 03-07-2023 of UGC.

LEAVE AND RE-ADMISSION RULES

1. Leave/duty leave will be applied on prescribed Proforma available in the college office. Leave up to 3 days shall be recommended by the teachers concerned and sanctioned by the Co-Ordinator. For leave exceeding 3 days, the application duly recommended by the teachers must be submitted to the principal.
2. Leave of absence from the examination/tests and sports etc. shall be granted only by the principal.
3. The name of the student who remains absent for 10 days continuously from any class, shall be struck off from the college rolls. However, the Principal at his/her discretion and after the recommendation from the teacher concerned may re-admit such students on the payment of the re-admission fee (which will be ₹ 100/- for the first time and ₹ 200/- for the second time). Such students must get re-admitted within 15 days from the date on which his/her name is struck off.

Note: A candidate whose name is struck off three times will not be re-admitted in the college.

IMPORTANT NOTE

1. The eligible students must produce their income certificate at the time of applying for the scholarship for the first time . (Notification No. EDN-H (10) B 2005-06 misc-dated 30 Jan. 2006). For further details contact the college office.
2. The meritorious students from the poor families are reimbursed full fee on production of BPL/IRDP certificate.
3. The students getting positions in HPU merit list, showing extraordinary achievement in Cultural activities or sports are given handsome amount of cash prizes from PTA fund and Self Finance fund.

LIBRARY

The department has a library, and the library rules are given below:

1. There is provision for library card for the students who wish to avail themselves library facilities. Duplicate card can be issued on payment of ₹50.00.
2. A book issued can be kept for a period of 15 days. Fine will be charged 1/- per day for any delay.
3. Textbooks and reference books will not be issued.
4. Students in all streams can borrow a maximum of 2 books for UG and 4 for PG classes at a time. The book must be handled carefully. Any loss or damages will have to be paid by the student with the permission of the principal.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE “AMBIKA”

The college Magazine “Ambika” is brought out every year to provide a forum to the students for an expression of their creative talents in form of articles, poems and stories etc. It also includes photographs of students who have participated in different college activities/events and those who

have excelled in academics during the session.

COLLEGE STUDENTS' CENTRAL ASSOCIATION (CSCA)

The CSCA of the college students is elected/nominated in the beginning of the new session as per the rules supplied by the university from time to time. The body helps the college authorities to maintain discipline in the college and facilitates the development activities. Election dates are notified by HPU after the admission process is over.

CAREER GUIDANCE AND PLACEMENT CELL

With the objective of providing timely information to the students regarding various career opportunities, a career guidance cell is functioning in the college. A team of dedicated teachers collects the information from various sources and disseminates the same by displaying it on the Notice Board.

NCC and NSS

NCC: The College has NCC units for boys. NCC inculcates in students a sense of duty, discipline, and leadership.

NSS: The National Service Scheme (NSS) currently has two units in this college, with an enrollment of 100 volunteers each, under the guidance of programme officers. Enrollment to NSS is made soon after the admission process is over.

SPORTS

The college provides adequate facilities for athletics and games like Volleyball, Kabaddi, Boxing, Football, Cricket, Basketball, Badminton, Table tennis, Chess etc.

CODE OF CONDUCT

1. The principal has discretionary powers regarding admissions, appearing for the examination, Disciplinary action, remission of fines, special punishment etc.
2. The principal has the right to regulate the activities of all bona fide students of the college, both inside and outside the college campus. If the Principal is convinced that the conduct of a student is against the rules and regulations, he/she can be expelled and rusticated without assigning any reason.
3. No Students will be allowed to take part in any political and disruptive activity.
4. All the rules mentioned in the prospectus and notified from time to time are binding on all students. Defaulters can be punished monetarily or through disciplinary action depending on the seriousness of misconduct.
5. Willful absence from the classes will be viewed seriously, and the name will be struck off.
6. Entry into the college office without any specific reason is prohibited. The student can meet the principal only during visiting hours, as notified on the board.
7. The schedule for filling up all the forms of HP University, including examination forms, will be displayed prominently on the Notice Board. Any student not adhering to the displayed schedule will himself be responsible for any administrative delay and late fee.

FOLLOWING ACTIVITIES WILL BE TREATED AS A BREACH OF DISCIPLINE:

1. Any disruptive activities or use of force.
2. Writing obscenities on walls, desks, and blackboards.
3. Making noise or raising slogans that disturb teaching on campus.
4. Smoking and entering the campus under the influence of drugs, Liquor etc.
5. Plucking flowers or damaging the plants in the college campus.
6. Bringing outsiders onto the campus.
7. Tampering with electrical fittings, fans, etc.
8. Misbehavior of any kind.
9. Use of cell phones on campus, in classrooms, in the library, and unauthorized use of loudspeakers and public address systems.
10. Coming to college without an identity card.

New Education Policy (NEP-2020) for BA/B.SC./B.COM 1ST YEAR STUDENTS UNDER SEMESTER SYSTEM

NEP 2020 has been implemented by the H.P. University from the academic session 2026-27. Under the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, Himachal Pradesh University has introduced a flexible, multidisciplinary, and student-centric undergraduate curriculum aimed at promoting holistic education, skill development, employability, and academic excellence. The undergraduate programme is based on a semester and credit-based framework with multiple entry and exit options, enabling students to learn at their own pace and according to their interests and career aspirations. The curriculum integrates traditional learning with practical exposure, research orientation, digital literacy, communication skills, value-based education, and experiential learning.

During the first year of study, students are offered three core disciplines along with Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC), Value Added Courses (VAC), and Internship/Apprenticeship/Project/Community Outreach components. This structure provides students with opportunities to explore different academic areas and acquire practical as well as professional skills. At the end of the second semester, students are required to choose their Major and Minor disciplines, which remain applicable throughout the programme as per university regulations. The curriculum also provides flexibility in subject selection across disciplines, thereby encouraging interdisciplinary and outcome-based learning.

The NEP framework emphasizes continuous assessment, academic flexibility, vocational exposure, research aptitude, innovation, and the effective use of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) in teaching-learning processes. Students are encouraged to participate in internships, community Engagement activities, field projects, seminars, and skill-oriented programmes to enhance their practical knowledge and career readiness. The four-year undergraduate structure also provides students with the opportunity to pursue a Bachelor's Degree with Honours or Honours with Research, subject to fulfillment of eligibility conditions prescribed by the University.

The programme further incorporates the Multiple Entry and Exit System, under which students may exit after one year with a UG Certificate, after two years with a UG Diploma, after successful completion of three years with a Bachelor's Degree, or continue the fourth year to obtain a Bachelor's Degree with Honours/Honours with Research. This innovative framework ensures greater academic mobility, flexibility, and inclusiveness while preparing students for higher education, competitive examinations, entrepreneurship, and diverse professional careers in the evolving global environment.

Significant Notes

1. The prescribed credit weightage includes Lecture, Tutorial, and Practical components.
2. In the first semester, students will be offered three different subjects within the same stream: A, B, and C (Core and Minor are provided here for illustrative purposes only).
3. At the end of the second semester, each student may choose one of two programmes: the Multi- Disciplinary/Interdisciplinary or Single Core Discipline (Major) programme. The student choosing the latter will be required to give his/her Major and Minor at the end of the second semester. Such choices, including DSCs made at the end of the second semester, shall remain in effect until the VI semester.
4. Additional Seats: The Colleges may create 10% extra seats over and above the sanctioned strength to accommodate the request for a change of major. Any unfilled or vacant seats may be filled with those seeking a change of Major. Preference will be given to those with the highest CGPA and no arrears in the first year/semester.
5. The DSCs of another discipline for the first two semesters of students who opt for Major programmes will be treated as Minors.
6. A DSC offered in one discipline will be treated as a Minor by another. Students can choose Minor Courses from two different subjects, but must earn a minimum of 12 credits in each.
7. MDCs must be selected from a broad discipline/pool of MDCs other than Major and Minor subjects.
8. AEC/VAC/SEC-3 should be chosen from a pool of courses. Every discipline shall provide these courses, some of which will be offered discipline-specific, while the rest can be open to students of all other disciplines. However, the two SECs (SEC-1 & SEC-2) must be chosen from the discipline-specific (Core and Minor).
9. A maximum of two language courses can be opted for as Core and Minor. AECs should be in a language other than what is studied in DSCs/Minors.
10. I/A/P/C will be determined at the end of the first semester to enable students to carry out some I/A/P/C activities during winter vacation.
11. To pursue an Honour degree in the 4th year, students will have to choose only one discipline in both semesters, in which s/he have studied 6 DSCs and 5 DSEs in the first three years.
12. A student who secures 75% or more marks in aggregate till semester 6 (up to a 3-year degree) shall be eligible for a 4-year degree Honours with Research, provided HPU has approved the college to offer it.
13. One course per semester (DSC/Minor/MDC/SEC/etc.) from a subject offered in two (or more) different programs (e.g. BCA and BSc/ BPA and BA/ BFA and BA/ Shastri and BA/etc.) must be the same.
14. Students in the BA programmes can opt for only one DSC each from the Bachelor of Performing Arts (Dance, Music, Vocal & Instrument/Tabla/ etc.) and the Bachelor of Fine Arts (Painting/Applied Arts/Sculpture/ etc.).
15. Major and Minor shall be awarded on fulfilment of the following conditions: For Major, 64 credits in a 3-year & 84 credits in a 4-year UG programme in a single Major Discipline. For Minor 28 credits in 4-year UG programme in a single Minor Discipline
16. The Dissertation and Project will start in the VII semester. However, the evaluation and assessment will be conducted in both the VII and VIII semesters.

- a) The pass marks in each subject shall be 45% while appearing in the examination within two available chances. The candidate placed in the compartment may be exempted from appearing in the paper in which he/she has already obtained the required pass marks.
- b) The aggregate marks obtained by the candidate in the BBA examination shall be the sum of the marks obtained by him in which he/she has passed

CAREER GUIDANCE & PLACEMENT CELL

Career Guidance & Placement Cell of this College organizes lectures, seminars, and workshops on career-related issues for the welfare of BBA, BCA & PGDCA students from time to time. Various lectures and workshops on career guidance were conducted during the session 2024-2025.

1. The cell successfully facilitated 30+ student placements during the academic session in reputed organizations and institutions including NIMS University Rajasthan, HDFC Bank, and HCL.
2. A Post Orientation Programme titled “Next Step Symposium-2024” was organized in collaboration with IQAC in May for the pass-out students of the 2023–24 batch to guide them about future career opportunities.
3. A One-Day Career Guidance and Placement Workshop was organized in collaboration with Jetking Chandigarh to inform students about emerging career options in the IT sector.
4. A Career Guidance Session on Communication Skills was conducted on 11 September 2025 to enhance students’ employability and professional communication abilities.
5. A Career Guidance and Placement Session was organized in collaboration with HCL for the HCL Tech Bee Programme, in which two students were selected.

6. An Assessment and Scholarship Test was conducted in collaboration with Crack Academy, in which more than 800 students participated, and over 100 students qualified for scholarships.
7. A Career Awareness Session was delivered by Dr. Arun Kumar Panoli (Professor and Dean, Baddi University of Emerging Sciences & Technology, Solan) under the institutional MoU to guide students about higher education and career pathways.
8. A Career Guidance Session was organized in collaboration with Physics Wallah IAS Academy, Chandigarh to guide students preparing for competitive examinations.
9. A One-Day Career Guidance Workshop on Overseas Education was conducted by IDP International Hoshiarpur under the institutional MoU to provide information about study opportunities abroad.
10. A 45-Day In-House Internship Programme on Digital Marketing and Startup was organized in collaboration with Cardiel Soul, in which four BBA students successfully completed the internship.
11. A Special Career Guidance Workshop on Opportunities in the Merchant Navy was conducted to make students aware of career prospects in the maritime sector.
